Supreme Court Visit Report

DES's Shri Navalmal Firodia Law College has organized Delhi Supreme Court Visit during 24 th February to 1 st March 2023 to Delhi, Agra, Amritsar. Total 40 students and 2 faculties visited Supreme court of India and Parliament House of India, Agra and Amritsar.

On Friday, 24.02.2023, the students of D.E.S. Shri Navalmal Firodia Law College visited the

Parliament of India. The tour began by introducing the students with the history of the Parliament and its structure as well as the future prospective of the commencement of the new Parliament building via documentary.

Being a law student it was an overwhelming moment to be in those very rooms and sit on those benches where the Constitutional Debates happened and the Constitution was drafted. Moreover, the students had the chance to peek into the rich heritage of our country and had witnessed the original handwritten Constitution. The students also witnessed the majestic structure of Sarnath Emblem which has been recently inaugurated by the Hon'ble Prime Minister.

The security of the Parliament was extremely vigilant, which proved that we were in the most secure buildings of the country. The students were enthralled by the infrastructure of the Parliament and were mesmerised by its intricacies which included the handmade scriptures, paintings, portraits, statutes and artefacts from the 20th Century. Before leaving the main building the students captured their experience in a picture in front of the main building.

The Supreme Court of India

The Supreme Court of India is the supreme judicial authority of India and the highest court of the Republic of India under the constitution. It is the highest constitutional court and has the final decision in all legal matters. It also has the power of judicial review.

On Saturday, 25.02.2023 the students of D.E.S. Shri Navalmal Firodia Law College had the golden opportunity to visit the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. The students were informed about the symbolic value of the structures which surround the Hon'ble Supreme Court and the significance of the symmetry. The law students then visited the courtroom No.1 i.e. the Chief Justice's Court.

In there, the structure and the sitting arrangements of the judges and its benches were explained and how the proceedings go on. We were informed that the Hon'ble Apex Court was at its fullest. The students were taken to the Judges Library where they were shown a documentary about how efficient and expeditious the working of the Hon'ble Court is. The new building has been allotted where the construction for new library is going on. The students enlightened themselves by walking in the premises of the Court.

All the aspiring lawyers had the opportunity to be in the vicinity of the Hon'ble Apex Court which was in itself an overwhelming feeling. The students tried to capture as many moments as they could and wished that one day they will come as advocates in this very court. Students stayed in Delhi two days and visited Prime Minister Museum , Rashtrapati Bhavan Garden , Sarojini Market etc.

Thereafter students of DES SNFLC visited Agra and visited one of the seven wonders of the World i.e Tajmahal The Taj Mahal is an Islamic ivory-white marble mausoleum on the right bank of the river Yamuna in Agra, Uttar Pradesh, India. It was commissioned in 1631 by the fifth Mughal emperor, Shah Jahan to house the tomb of his favourite wife, Mumtaz Mahal; it also houses the tomb of Shah Jahan himself. It was mesmerizing sight for everyone.

Our next stop was Amritsar. one of the most spiritual places in India, the Golden Temple, also known as Sri Harmandir Sahib, is the holiest shrine in all of Sikhism. All the students and faculties visited Golden temple. Last day, we visited Wagah border Wagah Border. The international border between India and Pakistan. The pomp and pageantry of the Beating Retreat and the Change of Guard within handshaking distance of the Indian and Pakistani forces makes for a most charming spectacle. Wagah, an army outpost on Indo-Pak border – between Amritsar and Lahore, is an elaborate complex of buildings, roads and barriers on both sides. The daily highlight is the evening "Beating the Retreat" ceremony. Soldiers from both countries march in perfect drill, going through the steps of bringing down their respective national flags. As the sun goes down, nationalistic fervour rises and lights are switched on marking the end of the day amidst thunderous applause.

Students witnessed this marvellous sight and chanted slogans like Vande Mataram and Bharat Mata Ki Jai . The entire environment was fulfilled with patriotism .
