The third edition of Themisia, Themisia 3.0, was successfully organized on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> of February 2025. It marked an innovative approach towards engaging students and professionals in the field of law. This year's theme, "Celebrating 75 Years of the Indian Constitution," emphasized the evolution, impact, and future trajectory of constitutional jurisprudence in India.

The event featured a National Judgment Analysis Competition, a Legal Quiz Competition, and an Intra-Collegiate Alternate Judgment Writing Competition, each designed to foster critical thinking, legal reasoning, and an in-depth understanding of Constitutional Principles. Additionally, an International Seminar on "75 Years of Indian Constitution: Past, Present, and a Way Forward" brought together legal scholars and practitioners to deliberate on the journey of the Indian Constitution.

Themisia 3.0 aimed to foster in-depth legal research, critical analysis of Constitutional Judgments, and engagement with key amendments shaping India's legal framework. It sought to enhance participants' ability to interpret, critique, and apply Constitutional provisions, fostering an understanding of judicial reasoning and legislative intent. Through competitions and discussions, the event allowed students and professionals to explore constitutional evolution, judicial activism, and future legal reforms.

The National Judgment Analysis Competition required participants to critically examine the Supreme Court's ruling in *In Re: Article 370 of the Constitution* (Citation: 2023 INSC 1058). The competition focused on assessing the judicial reasoning, its impact and broader implications on the Indian legal system. Participants were required to submit a well-researched written analysis and visually present their findings before the judges, showcasing their perspectives with legal reasoning and precedents. The Legal Quiz Competition, on Amendments of the Indian Constitution, tested participants' knowledge of Constitutional Amendments, their historical significance, and their impact on governance and democratic principles. The quiz was designed to evaluate quick thinking and legal expertise and challenged the participants to apply their knowledge in a competitive and intellectually stimulating environment.

The Intra-Collegiate Alternate Judgment Writing Competition focused on the Supreme Court case: *Supriyo v. Union of India*, 2023 (Citation: 2023 INSC 920). Participants were required to critically assess the judgment and draft an alternative ruling paper, offering a different legal interpretation while maintaining coherence with the Constitution.

The International Seminar on “75 Years of Indian Constitution: Past, Present, and a Way Forward”, brought together eminent jurists, academicians, and researchers to discuss key aspects of India’s constitutional journey. The seminar explored the historical evolution of the Constitution, its foundational principles, and its role in shaping governance and democracy.

The competitions were evaluated by distinguished legal professionals and academicians, ensuring rigorous assessment and insightful feedback. For the National Judgment Analysis competition, Adv. Shraddha Jadhav, Adv. Ashwini Patil, Adv. Nikita Garg, Anurita Yadav, Rahi Alhat and Priya Mondal were invited to judge the Qualifying Round. Dr. Sanjay Bang and Dr. Lakshman Brahmawar were invited to judge the Final Round.

For the Intra-Collegiate Alternate Judgment Writing Competition, Adv. Sushama Kadam and Adv. Bhagyashree Bora were invited as judges.

The Valedictory ceremony, held within the college premises, was graced by the presence of Hon’ble Justice Prasanna B. Varale, Judge, Supreme Court of India who enlightened us upon various topics related to law. Book titled “ 106 Constitutional Amendments : A Journey through the Evolution of Indian Constitution” authored by Dr Sunita Adhav and Dr Aishwarya Yadav was also unveiled during the valedictory session.

Out of the 30 teams, Ms. Akanksha Bulani and Ms. Khushi Bulani from Vasantryao Pawar Law College, Baramati were declared as the Winner of National Judgment Analysis Competition, and Ms. Ankita Jain and Ms. Kinjal Alok from MNLU Aurangabad stood as the Runner- ups.

Mr. Satish Patole and Ms. Amruta Patil from Sinhgad Law College, Pune were declared as the Winners of Legal Quiz Competition, and Ms. Sanyukta Londhe and Roshni from Army Law College, Pune stood as the Runner-ups.

Out of the 45 participants, Ms. Ruhee Desai from 3<sup>rd</sup> B.A.LL.B was declared as the Winner of Intra-Collegiate Alternate Judgment Writing Competition, and Mr. Abhishek Kolsepatil from 5<sup>th</sup> B.A.LLB stood as the Runner-up.

Themisia 3.0 successfully provided an engaging academic and professional platform for students, scholars, and legal practitioners. The competitions encouraged critical thinking, legal analysis, and research skills, while the International Seminar facilitated thought-provoking discussions on constitutional evolution.
